This has been a year full of many changes for the animal welfare group. As the year comes to a close, they look to the future with hope. The new Executive Director is brimming with ideas and cheer.

Adoption events have resulted in the adoptions of many unwanted pets that need a second chance. LAPS is cooperating with other animal-welfare groups such as PAWS, Pet Haven, Gateway Gatos and the City of Laredo Health Department sponsoring low-cost spay/neuter clinics to combat the overwhelming cat and dog overpopulation crisis, with growing success.

Located at 2500 Gonzalez St in Laredo, The LAPS Laredo Animal Shelter, is no longer an impound facility and is now fully embracing its status as a No-Kill shelter... it returns to the hope of being an unwanted pet's pathway to a second chance.

According to Shelter Director Michelle Deveze, "The single most important thing we can do as a community to save cats and dogs from terrible suffering and death due to the over-population crises, is to spay and neuter our pets. As of November 2012, no pet will leave our facility until it is spayed or neutered!"

In 2012, LAPS helped to spay and neuter over 1,000 dogs and cats. Over 300 credit vouchers have also been granted to help lower the cost of spay/neuter for those who otherwise might not have afforded it thanks to The United Way of Laredo,

The Laredo Animal Protective Society (LAPS) ends this year of transition with gratitude in our hearts. Although it has been a year fraught with challenges, we have met each one with a positive attitude and with the loving support of our community and local veterinarians, giving us the strength to move forward. We are happy to report our present status as a No Kill Shelter, the result of our transition away from serving as the impound and euthanasia facility for Laredo Animal Control. We are grateful to start each day with peace at our facility and in our hearts and focused on our mission.

The LAPS mission is to provide shelter for homeless, adoptable dogs and cats in Laredo and Webb County until we can successfully find them permanent homes; we address the dog and cat overpopulation crisis by helping to provide affordable spay/neuter services to the community; and we are working to eliminate animal cruelty and neglect through education.

The Laredo Animal Shelter pioneered bringing mobile clinics to Laredo. We are also grateful to be working with likeminded non-profits Pet Haven, PAWS and Gateway Gatos as well as the City of Laredo by helping to organize these low-cost spay/neuter clinics. Together we have successfully "fixed" hundreds of animals that will no longer reproduce! Hooray!



LOW COST SPAY/NEUTER

LAPS brought the SNAP Mobile Veterinary Spay/Neuter Clinic to Laredo in July and over 60 pets were "fixed." Also, thanks to a grant from the Gateway Rotary, the Clinic was brought back in September, allowing us to spay/neuter over 60 more pets in our community for those who otherwise would not have been able to afford it. We still have big job to do as Laredo moves towards becoming a "No Kill" Community.



We ask you to please remember, when you adopt a LAPS pet, you are not only saving one life, but two...the one you are adopting and the one who will take its place at the shelter! Our Laredo Animal Shelter has successfully found stable homes for over 600 pets in the year 2012.
